The Saskatchewan Woodworkers' Guild (SWG) has created an annual Woodworkers' Development Grant program. The grant is intended to enable successful applicants to improve their knowledge and skills set and then share that with our guild members and other interested groups through workshops, education, and/or a career in one of the many woodworking disciplines. Up to \$1,500 will be awarded each year. The SWG selection committee reserves the right to grant all or part of the value for any successful request.

Applicants must be at least 18 years of age and have an existing background in woodworking. The SWG grant committee must receive the application by December 31, 2017. The SWG selection committee may request an interview with the applicant(s) before a decision is made.
